Federal Budget 2018

In the lead up to the Federal Budget announced in late-February, Chicken Farmers of Canada anticipated for another strong focus on agriculture as seen in the 2017 Budget. While disappointed that the Budget did not address funding for poultry research, trade mitigation, and new programs promised with the 2015 TPP announcement, we support the Budget's focus on women in agriculture, minimal small business tax changes, and the government's continued commitment to supply management. We look forward to further discussion with the Minister's office and MPs on how this budget can positively impact Canadian farmers.
