SUPPORTING CANADIANS THIS SUMMER

INTERNATIONAL TRADE COMMITTEE MEETING ON SPENT FOWL

The House Standing Committee on International Trade held an emergency summer meeting on August 3rd to discuss the issue of spent fowl with department officials from across government. Committee members questioned why the fraud that has been occurring with spent fowl hasn't been rectified yet, and urged the departments to put a solution onto the Minister's desk as soon as possible. Government officials also answered questions about Trent University's DNA test, the increase in spent fowl imports, and economic losses.

Chicken Farmers of Canada then appeared as a witness before the Committee on September 20th in the second half of a meeting that saw the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food address the issue of spent fowl and the Duties Relief Program first. The Minister could not give a timeline as to when the issues will be resolved, but reassured members and stakeholders that they are diligently working toward ending this fraud.

SUPPORTING BILL C-274

Chicken Farmers of Canada was pleased to see MP Guy Caron introduce Bill C-274 *An Act to amend the Income Tax Act (transfer of small business or family farm or fishing corporation*). This Bill would give owners and buyers from the same family the same taxation rights extended to those non-related individuals who are involved in the sale of a farm.
