

## NAFTA Talks Continue

The North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) re-negotiations are still ongoing. While the first three rounds focused on establishing the draft consolidated texts that the negotiating teams work from, overall, any progress since has been overshadowed by a series of outrageous proposals tabled by the U.S. during the second stream of negotiations.

These proposals include highly restrictive rules of origin on autos, a sunset proposal that would undermine the very stability and certainty that trade agreements are meant to provide, as well as the elimination of all Canadian tariffs on imports of U.S. dairy, poultry, and egg products, essentially dismantling one of the critical pillars of Canada's supply management system.

Chicken Farmers of Canada appreciates that these requests have all been firmly rejected by the Canadian government as non-starters. Based on the progress to date, it is difficult to imagine that substantive progress will made before the spring of 2018, let alone the achievement of a deal. Chicken Farmers of Canada continues to monitor the talks, attending all rounds in order to work closely with Canadian officials and provide advice on how to ensure a positive outcome for the Canadian chicken sector.
